HOUSE CORPORATION PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

GOOD NEWS, SAD NEWS

T he chapter has pledged a great group of young men this spring. I look forward to working with them over the next few years. As usual, we have wide geographic representation.

On the safety and security front, last year we discovered serious structural flaws in the eastern side of the chapter house. Temporary measures were taken during the year to shore up the foundation, and permanent remedial work was performed over the summer to correct the problems. A steel beam supported by three pillars was installed through the middle of the basement barroom. Unfortunately, the pillars detract from the aesthetics of the room, but they were necessary to restore the structural integrity.

On a sadder note, we lost an undergraduate brother over Christmas break. Yash Kasbekar was a Wharton junior; he was killed in an automobile accident on New Year's Day. Last semester, Yash was elected executive vice president of the Interfraternity Council and was also inducted into Omega, the Greek Honor Society. I attended an emotional memorial service for Yash in the Hall of Flags in Houston Hall in mid-January. We mourn his loss and send our condolences to his family.

Finally, four Penn Theta alumni from the early '90s (Mike Pelzar, Andrew Hudson, Pat Doyle and Dave Ferrero) will be running the 106th Boston Marathon on Monday, April 15, 2002, as part of the Run for Research team of the American Liver Foundation (ALF). ALF is a national, voluntarily funded health organization dedicated to preventing, treating and curing hepatitis and other liver diseases through research and education. The Penn Theta team is responsible for raising a minimum of \$10,000. They have been training since November in the cold New England winter.
