SAE Is Keeping Busy with Philanthropy Events and Academic Achievements


The Chapter's "Preppy Games" Is Becoming an Important Event on Campus

The active chapter has had a busy year, starting off with a charity Halloween event, co-hosted with Kappa Alpha Theta sorority, at the chapter house for a West Philadelphia elementary school. Each brother donated at least four hours to the project.

Our main philanthropy event for the year was the Preppy Games on April 6, which we co-hosted with Alpha Chi Omega sorority. It began as the brainchild of thenphilanthropy chair Kyle Hutchison '14 and materialized into a great event on College Green in which students donated to teams for various events. The event was sponsored by the clothing company Jack Wills. We hope to make the SAE Preppy Games into a seminal philanthropy event that will become one of the most popular Greek philanthropy events held at Penn.

During spring break, our actives took advantage of the opportunity to visit alumni across the country, including New York, Washington D.C., and California. Having our newest members meet some of our recent alumni, including past pledge masters, helped bring in the idea that the SAE experience does not end after college and allowed some of our recent alums to interact with the new pledge class.

Academically, we are on good footing. The chapter GPA is 3.438, higher than the total undergrad average, the InterFraternity Council Average, and the all-male average. The chapter's collective GPA has risen from 20th to 10th out of thirty fraternities in the past year.



We are also pleased to announce that the chapter has been nominated for three awards from Penn this year: the Alumni Relations award, the Joseph C. Mancini Service and Philanthropy Award, and the University Relations Award. Two brothers, Steve Carroll '13 and Sam Ruddy '15, competed at the Ivy League Championships for swimming recently and other brothers have received important internships and job opportunities, including summer internships at Facebook, Google, Microsoft, and Macy's. Also, this past summer we were represented at the 77th John O. Moseley Leadership School, SAE's yearly leadership school held on a Royal Caribbean Cruise.

SAE had another successful recruitment season with more than 400 rushes coming through the door. One particularly memorable event was attending a 76ers game with tickets being provided by Josh Harris '86. Steve Saltzman '85, head of our alumni organization, was also in attendance. We also hosted a date party downtown for brothers and rushes, as well as our annual final dinner, which past Eminent Archon Henry Litman '12 attended. Going back to the fall, we were able to show off our house via an openregistered beach party, in which we filled our courtyard with roughly seven tons of sand. By getting SAE's name out there in such a fashion early on, we were able to meet many of our future new members early on in the school year. Included in the new class is legacy Luke Ignaczak, son of Tony Ignaczak '86.

At the end of recruitment, we welcomed 28 new members. This is our largest pledge class in years and also the largest pledge class on campus, with the highest bid return rate. It cements SAE as the largest fraternity on



I have been fortunate to be getting back in touch with folks bit by bit outside of my busy life schedule as a radiologist and father of two girls, Carson age 11 and Maddox age 7.

In 2004, I decided to get my "running health" back by training for and running a marathon while in Nashville at Vanderbilt. I eventually qualified for Boston and then hit the ultramarathon scene. I have since run some of the most difficult 100 mile races in the country and am a two time finisher of what most believe to be the most difficult footrace on the planet, the Badwater 135. My guess is I may be the only Penn grad to have done so.

In 2010, I ran the length of the Erie Canal (344m in 6 days) and am the only one to have done that.
