VICE PRESIDENT'S LETTER

A Letter from the Penn Theta Board

Dear Penn Theta SAE Alumni Brothers: *Phi Alpha!*

The Fall session has started and Actives have returned to the Chapter and our House. All are excited to be together again and plan a year of scholastic and athletic achievement, School and community service

projects and Brother-bonding social events including with Penn SAE alums.

We enter the Fall session with 60 active members, of which 14 are in residence in house, all singles. About 30 Brothers are on House meal plan.

The overriding problem causing this low occupancy (capacity about 25) is due to Penn's policy of requiring Sophomores to live in campus housing (definition excludes Fraternity and Sorority houses even when Penn owned) and with School meal plans that is making it difficult to fill the House. Most actives not living in the House are in fact living together in other campus or off-campus housing so living together is not the issue; the issue is *where*. The architect of Penn's disastrous program has left the School's employment but not after attempting to destroy Penn's Greek community.

We are doing our best to push back on the above School policy and all Greek houses are suffering similar consequences. We brief you here so that you can add to our voices in your own interactions, communications and financial support of the School. 


